1. The intricacies of manufacturing Opal Wool

Before our balls of wool reach the customer, they have undergone a manufacturing process controlled by craftsmen who take a pride in their work.

Firstly, the bobbins are positioned for printing. The actual printing process is an ingenious "TOP SECRET" procedure that gives Opal wool its unique appearance. The skeins are then hand bound and the bobbins placed in position again.

The wool is then steamed and washed. After drying, the wool is wound onto cones and steamed yet again before being wound into balls.

These are the numerous procedures leading up to the finished ball of wool that is then packed by hand before arriving at your local wool shop.

2. Soft, fine wool is our chief concern

We invest years of experience and knowledge in the elaborate manufacturing process of Opal wool so that your knitted garments remains soft to touch.

Before carefully washing the wool (to prevent it the colours from bleeding after purchase), we steam it for the first time. We then allow it to dry before steaming again.

We then leave it undisturbed for 24 hours so that it becomes soft and voluminous before being wound into balls.

Not until it has been subject to this special pro- cess, does Opal wool become soft yet wear-resistant.

This is the pledge of quality we give our customers to ensure that they have many years of enjoyment.
